Some touching imprints on the childhood minds are always everlasting. I remember with nostalgia an indelible memory of an incident related to me by my mother many years ago. She being of orthodox and unscientific thought pattern said to me that when I was in her womb, there was an epidemic of small pox and we were affected by it. She would regularly go to the Church and pray for healing on her knees right from the Entrance to the Sanctuary through the intercession of Mother of Perpetual Succor. We were healed without any medical treatment. We absolutely believed that it was a miraculous cure.

Now, Be that as it may, the Covid-19 Corona Virus Pandemic, is perhaps the greatest disaster of the millennium which has shaken the edifice of humanity from its very foundations, as never before.

Its onslaught on human lives, jobs, economy, travels, security, safety, students, teaching fraternity, and Education has been alarming, as thousands have succumbed to the deadly Corona Virus.



Research Work

In a female reproductive system, a regular natural change occurs periodically

due to the rise and fall of a hormone called estrogen.

This cycle results in the thickening of the lining of the uterus, and the growth of an egg, (which is required for pregnancy). These eggs are formed inside an ovary.

Besides the OVARIAN CYCLE, there is an additional cycle called UTERINE CYCLE occurring in UTERUS which aids generation of a special type of cells called STEM CELLS. A STEM CELL is a cell with the unique ability to develop into specialized cell types in the body.

UTERINE STEM CELLS aid in creating an environment for regeneration of OVARIAN & UTERINE CYCLES. Absence of them or damage to them, naturally or artificially results in various situations that may cause INFERTILITY.

My research work was finding these causes that effect those UTERINE STEM CELLS. The experimental works were not carried on animals with similar internal biological system such as mice.

I would like many you students to study well and become Scientists. I'm proud to be a Marian.


